- 6. **Description of content:** Temporary emergency measures on increased plant health import checks at a minimum frequency and enforcement of wood packaging material (WPM) used to transport certain commodities to the EU originating in China. Plant health checks will check that EU import requirements for WPM are complied with.
- 7. Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [] animal health, [X] plant protection, [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [X] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- 8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: Recent plant health checks by Member States have shown that wood packaging material used in the transport of certain commodities originating from China was infested by harmful organisms, in particular by *Anoplophora glabripennis* (Motschulsky) (ALB), particularly consignments of heavy material such as granite. Such situations have been linked to several local outbreaks of ALB that needed extensive eradication measures.
